

Service Events of the Semester

November 28

There was a total of 10 service events for this semester. They are Habit for Humanity, Food Bank of Iowa, Furry Friends Refuge, Tie Blankets, Central Iowa shelter and services, Free Rice, Park Clean up, Meals from the Heartland, and Veteran's cards.

There are a number of off-campus service events. For *Habitat for Humanity*, we helped build a house that will help people to have a place to stay. We had two separate days for *Furry Friends* to help clean shelter and take care of animals. During the *Food Bank of Iowa* event, we help to fill bags to help feed school children that don't have access to food at home. We made a new record of 227 boxes, which is 2270 meals worth in 2 hours!

We served food to people during the service event of *Central Iowa Shelter and services* and helped to clean up Sargent park and Gay Lea Wilson Trails during the *Park Clean-Up* Service event. *Meals from the heartland* are where we fill bags with rice and other non-perishable food



The three on-campus or virtual are *Tie Blankets*, *Free rice*, *and Veteran's cards*. We made six tie blankets with three large and three small sizes. We are donating them to the Linus project. Free rice is a website that is run by the united nations to feed starving children with rice. It is a quiz based website that anyone could access. In addition, Veteran's cards are holiday and neutral cards to boost the spirits of deployed men and women over the holidays.




